The Dallas Baptist University Debate Team eagerly invites you to attend the 2nd annual **DBU Invitational IPDA Tournament**. The tournament will take place **February 23-25**, **2024**. We are excited to offer all four IPDA divisions of individual debate as well as TIPDA. There will be **six** preliminary individual rounds and **four** team debate rounds. Outrounds will be determined based on the number of entries. Greyson Goebel will serve as Tournament Director and tab will be run by Preston Langley and Justin Hamilton. We offer our warmest appreciation to our colleagues for volunteering their time and helping ensure that our tournament runs smoothly and efficiently.

The competition will take place on top of the University Hill located on our beautiful campus. We also provide a number of food/drink options across campus. These will be open for the duration of the competition on Friday and Saturday.

The tournament fees for this tournament will be \$25 per individual debate competitor and \$50 per team. The tournament will require you to bring along one judge for every four individual competitors and two teams. For each uncovered competitor, there will be an additional \$20 charge. Please bring along judges to help with our judging pool!

Tournament registration closes on **February 21st**, at **noon (CST)**. After this, there will be a \$10 fee (each) for altering registrations. No changes will be accepted after **noon (CST) on February 22nd**. The earlier, the better!

### **TOURNAMENT GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES**

We are going to run this tournament in accordance with all International Public Debate Association rules. Speech times will follow the classic IPDA format:

IPDA: 5-2-6-2-3-5-3

TIPDA: 4-2-5-2-5-2-4-2-3-4-4-3

Novice, Junior Varsity, Varsity, Professional, and one division of Team Debate will be offered. Please check the IPDA Constitution & Bylaws for information on division eligibility.

There will be six preliminary individual debate rounds and four preliminary team debate rounds. We will determine the number of outrounds based on the number of competitors/teams in each division in accordance with IPDA standards. See the schedule for a tentative idea.

We are looking to keep the tournament strictly on time. This means that rules regarding draw and debate times will be **strictly enforced**. Draw times begin the moment the debaters are given the resolutions (before strike), and they must start debating **30 minutes after**. A maximum grace period of **5 minutes** will be given, after which, the absent side forfeits. In this situation, the competitor should immediately contact their coach, who should contact the tournament director/tab. In the event that a judge is not on time, the competitors and coaches should immediately notify tab. Off-time roadmaps are **NOT** allowed for the sake of time.

As a reminder, **NO** electronic devices may be allowed in-round. The only exception is a stopwatch or kitchen timer (Phone timers may **NOT** be used).

It is expected that all competitors, judges, coaches, and guests be respectful at all times. Competitors are encouraged to notify their coach of any disrespectful or unsportsmanlike behavior. Coaches, judges, and guests are encouraged to contact tournament staff about any type of disrespectful or unsportsmanlike behavior. We all want to have a good time, so let's keep things clean, professional, and respectful! (but also fun!)

As a condition of entry, you agree that all decisions made by the tournament director are binding and final.

### AWARDS AND SWEEPSTAKES

We will be awarding the top 5 speakers in each division. For determining speaker awards in individual debate, we will look first at high/low adjusted speaker points and second to total speaker points. For team debate, we will look to total speaker points, then to high/low adjusted points to break any ties.

We will be awarding competition awards to each person/team who breaks to outrounds. For determining competitors advancing to elimination rounds in individual debate we will look first at the number of wins, second at high/low adjusted speaker points, and third at the number of total speaker points. For team debate, we will first look to the number of wins, and second to the total number of speaker points.

We will be awarding sweepstakes awards to the top 3 schools in each division, including IPDA and TIPDA. Additionally, we will award the top 3 schools overall. There will also be a top community college award. Sweepstakes will be calculated in this way:

#### IPDA:

3 points for each win (counts for up to three competitors in each division) 3 points for each break (counts for up to three competitors in each division)

#### TIPDA:

6 points for each win (counts for up to two teams in each division) 6 points for each break (counts for up to two teams in each division)

### **Speaker Awards:**

1st place - 5 points 2nd place - 4 points 3rd place - 3 points 4th place- 2 points 5th place- 1 point

We will also have two special awards for the program with the highest overall win percentage and the program with the highest average of high/low adjusted speaker points in IPDA. Programs will need a minimum of 5 entries in individual debate (any divisions) to be awarded these.

### **HOTELS & PARKING INSTRUCTIONS**

With the exception of Friday, most of the tournament activities will be located on top of the hill. We will have a portion of the parking lot in front of the Chapel building blocked off for tournament parking.

**From Kiest:** Follow the road up the hill, take a right at the stop sign, and pull into the parking lot in front of the Pilgrim Chapel.

**From Mountain Creek:** Follow the road up the hill, go straight through two stop signs, take a left at the stop sign after passing the dorms, and pull into the Pilgrim Chapel parking lot.

ON FRIDAY ONLY: TIPDA may have to be held at the bottom of the hill. In that event, TIPDA competitions will take place in the Moon Internation Building and Sadler Global Missions Center. There should be enough parking in the area around the buildings.

**From Kiest:** Go through the gate and take the first right. Go down the hill and you should turn right after you pass the first set of apartments. Take a right turn before the bridge.

From Mountain Creek: Take an immediate left after going through the gate, follow the road all the way around campus (passing housing, and the baseball and soccer fields), and then take a left right after you pass the first apartment building. Take a right turn before the bridge.

Changes will be accepted until **February 23rd at noon (CST)** with a **\$10 fee for each alteration**. After this date and time, no changes will be allowed to be made.

We are requiring that every school bring **one judge** for every **four individual** competitors and **two teams.** For each uncovered competitor or team, there will be a **\$20** additional charge. Please remember that judges will be required to judge one round past their school's elimination. Non-breaking competitors will be used to judge as well.

Payments will be accepted as cash or check. If you pay in check, please make it out to the "DBU Patriot Debate Program." We will email registration confirmations to each coach on Wednesday, February 22nd. A receipt will be available upon payment at the tournament.
