48th ANNUAL RED RIVER Classic

Dear Colleagues,

The LSUS Debate Team invites you to the 47th Annual Red River Classic. This tournament will run Nov. 4-6, 2023. The Red River Classic will offer competition in all four IPDA divisions (Professional, Varsity, Junior Varsity, & Novice) as well as Team IPDA.

All entries must be received by **Tue., October 31st, 2023, at 5:00 pm CDT** in **ForensicsTournament.net**. Changes will be accepted without charge until **Thursday., November 3rd, 2023 at 12:00 p.m. CDT** at which point fees will be set. Late fees will be charged for any changes after the 4th at noon CDT (in addition to any fees associated with the entry); any changes beyond this deadline must be sent to AJ.Edwards@lsus.edu. All entries must be covered by judges. 1 judge will cover 2 TIPDA entries and 1 judge will cover 4 IPDA entries. The registration site is <https://forensicstournament.net/lsusredriverclassic/23>

IPDA Fees: \$30 per competitor

Uncovered entries will be an additional charge of \$15, we reserve the right to refuse entries based on the inability of teams to cover their entries.

DIVISIONS & POINTS FORMULA:

The tournament reserves the right to limit entries if necessary. We will host all four divisions (Nov, JV, Var, Pro) of IPDA competition. The top three debaters in each division will count towards Sweepstakes calculations.

All IPDA debate rounds shall follow the 5-2-6-2-3-5-3 time format with 30 minutes preparation time. Divisions offered will be Novice, Junior Varsity, Varsity, and Professional. 7 preliminary rounds and the appropriate number of elimination rounds will be offered. See IPDA Debate.info for division eligibility requirements (or simply ask us if you need clarification).

TIPDA will follow the 4-2-5-2-5-2-4-2-3-4-4-3 time format. We will offer 4 preliminary rounds with the appropriate amount of elimination rounds to follow.

Debate points will be awarded according to the following formula:

- 3 points for each preliminary round win
- 3 points for breaking to elimination rounds
- 5 points for 1st speaker
- 4 points for 2nd speaker
- 3 points for 3rd speaker
- 2 points for 4th speaker
- 1 point for 5th speaker

Advancing Competitors and Tiebreaker Formula:

Debate: For determining competitors advancing to elimination rounds in individual debate we will look first to the number of wins, second to high/low adjusted speaker points and third to the number of total speaker points. For determining speaker awards in individual debate, we will look first to high/low adjusted speaker points and second to total speaker points.

TIPDA: Determination for advancing to elimination rounds will first to the number of wins, second to the total number of speaker points, third to competitor ranks. For speaker awards we will look to total points and then adjust to high/lows to break any ties.

EVENT INFORMATION:

A. General information

1. No minimum number of entries is required for schools to count toward debate sweepstakes awards.
2. We will provide ADA accommodations upon request; please let us know at the time you enter if you need any special arrangements.

The tab room will operate on a closed basis; tab staff will be available via chat and cellphone

B. IPDA/TIPDA Considerations

1. Please adhere to all rules expressed in the Bylaws and Constitution of the IPDA.
2. In order to keep the tournament running on time, please remind your competitors that they should activate their timers when draw begins, not after the strike process ends.
3. Please remind your judges that electronic devices are NOT permitted for anyone in a round, including the judge.

C. Tournament Ethics Statement

1. The behavior of all attending the Red River Classic will be in keeping with the [NCA Policy on Anti-Harassment Code of Conduct](#). We encourage all programs to review these expectations prior to entering this tournament.
2. The LSUS Red River Classic expects that behavior between all participants, coaches, judges, and guests be respectful and appropriate at all times. If any participant has concerns over propriety or good sportspersonship, they should discuss the matter with their coaching staff. Any coach, judge, or guests should address any concerns with the Tournament Director exclusively.
3. As a condition of entry, all participants, coaches, judges, and guests agree that any decision issued by the Tournament Director is binding and final.

JUDGES:

All entries must be covered. One judge during debate rounds covers four (4) IPDA debaters. 1 judge covers two (2) TIPDA teams. As is commonplace in IPDA, once eliminated from competition, IPDA competitors may be used to judge IPDA elimination rounds. All judges are obligated to judge one round past the last round of the teams elimination. We will reserve the right to limit entries to make certain we can provide sufficient judging pools needed to keep clean rounds throughout the tournament.

Please Note: All entries must be received in ForensicsTournament.net by **Tuesday, October 31st at 5:00 p.m.** Changes will be accepted without charge until **Thursday, November 2nd at**

noon, at which point fees will be set. Late fees of \$15.00 per alteration will be due for any changes after Wednesday, November 4th at noon (in addition to any fees associated with the entry). Any changes made after noon on Wednesday will need to be directly emailed to AJ.Edwards@lsus.edu , and will be subject to a fee of \$15.00 per alteration, correction, or drop.

As is our tradition at the Red River Classic, any programs new to the event or new to the Red River will either receive a fee waiver or a reduction in fees. This will be judged according to program size and number of entries. Further, if your program is facing budgetary concerns due to cuts or Covid-19 please contact us and we will either wave all fees or reduce the fees accordingly dependent on program entry size. We want everyone to have the best possible chance to compete and are willing to make all possible financial accommodations.

Coaches please let me know of any ADA request at the time of entry into the tournament so that we can make such accommodations.

LSUS Debate Tournament COVID-19 Protocols

Policy

Louisiana State University Shreveport and the LSUS Debate team wish to take all necessary and reasonable steps to ensure that visitors to campus have a safe and educational experience while on campus. In this spirit we will be instituting the following protocols and procedures for all visiting teams and its members.

Visitor Policy

While COVID cases in our region are lower than the previous year, we still ask that all participants follow CDC guidelines for hand washing and sanitation of used spaces.

Use of Face Coverings

Face coverings are not currently mandated by the state of Louisiana. We do ask that all participants be respectful of any persons that still choose to wear a face covering. Additionally, should the state mandate a face covering policy, LSUS will comply fully with this mandate.

Social Distancing

We are strongly encouraging all participants to avoid extraneous physical contact (hugs, handshakes, etc.) as a means of reducing any risk of inadvertent transmission of bacteria or viruses. While we realize that students will be enthused to see friends from other programs, we hope that this simple step will help promote the safest event possible.

Symptom Monitoring

We are asking each coach/sponsor to monitor participants from their programs for complaints of symptoms or any physiological signs of illness; we will have the ability to digitally take temperatures upon request for any participant requesting it based on symptoms they may exhibit. Any participant exhibiting symptoms consistent with COVID exposure is strongly

encouraged to self-isolate in their hotels; LSUS does ask that anyone who has been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID, or is exhibiting symptoms consistent with COVID, not attend this year's event in an effort to promote the public good for the other participants.
