The forensics teams of Texas Christian University and West Texas A&M University cordially invite you to the Cowtown Classic Swing, to be hosted on the beautiful sunny campus of Texas Christian University October 26-28, 2018.

We invite you to join us for a weekend of competition featuring two complete individual event tournaments with th eleven AFA events, and a debate tournament with Parliamentary and IPDA debate formats. Each individualevent tournament (TCU Invitational on Saturday and WTAMU Invitational on Sunday) will include two preliminary rounds and a final (semi-finals if necessary). Parliamentary Debate will include five, and IPDA six preliminary rounds on Friday, and out-rounds as needed on Saturday. IPDA will include novice, JV, and varsity divisions if warranted by entry sizes of each event. Divisions may be collapsed if small entry sizes warrant.

Students may enter in either Parliamentary or IPDA on Friday, but not both. Students may enter three individual events per pattern. Two duos counts as two events.

Entries

Deadline: Entries should be sent no later than 5:00 on Tuesday, October 23. Entries may be submitted through Joy of Tournaments. Drops and changes may be made without penalty until Wednesday, October 24 at 5:00. Changes after this time will incur an additional fee of \$10 per slot.

Debate Limitations: Students may enter either Parli or IPDA, but not both. The tournament directors reserve the right to collapse divisions of debate if entry size warrants this action. Debate divisions offered: Open Parliamentary Debate. IPDA Varisty, JV, Novice.

Individual Event Limitations: Students may enter a maximum of three individual events per pattern. Competitors may enter two duos (with different partners), but this will count as two events in pattern A. Students entered in multiple events will be responsible for making it to their rounds on time, and should endeavor to sign in. The tournament directors reserve the right to limit the number of entries from a school, and to balance rounds to accommodate judging obligations from schools with large entries.

Event Rules

We will follow AFA rules for individual events. Open internet access will be allowed in extemp prep.

Parliamentary teams will be given 15 minutes of preparation time following topic announcement. IPDA debate will follow IPDA guidelines. Debaters will be given 30 minutes of preparation time following topic draw. Debaters are expected to be in their competition rooms at the end of prep time, and a late forfeiture rule will be enforced. IPDA will be flighted, and offer three divisions: Novice, JV, Varsity.

Fees

Individual Events: \$10 (one judge covers 6 slots) Judging Fee Per Uncovered Individual Events: \$12 ParliTeams: \$75 (one judge covers 2 teams) Judging Fee Per Uncovered Parli Team: \$50 IPDA: \$30 (one judge covers four debaters) Judging Fee Per Uncovered IPDA: \$25 Drops at Registration: fee + \$25. Dropped judges: \$100 each.





Awards

Awards will be given to the top six competitors in each individual event, and out-round participants in debate. Debate events will also include speaker awards for the top 3 speakers. The top novice competitor in each category will also be recognized.

Individual Sweepstakes: The top three individual students in individual sweepstakes will receive an award. Eligibility requires students to compete in four events, which must include at least one event from interpretation events (Prose, Duo, POI, DI, Poetry) and one public address/limited preparation event (Inf, Imp, Ext, Pers, CA, ADS). Two duos may not both count toward individual sweeps.

Team Sweepstakes: The top three schools will be recognized with an award for individual events sweeps, debate sweeps, and combined debate/IE. Sweepstakes awards will be calculated with the following formula:

Tournament Practices

The WTAMU and TCU may enter novice competitors in their own half of the IE swing, but these students will be ineligible for individual sweeps. TCU and WTAMU competitors will be entered in debate events. Tournament directors reserve the right to place students from the same team into the same section of IEs to conserve judges.

TCU is a smoke-free campus. Please refrain from tobacco use on campus.

A number of food options are available both on campus, and within walking distance. Information will be provided at registration. The tournament will provide pizza for debaters on Friday evening, and continental breakfast and light lunch on Saturday and Sunday. We will also provide a hospitality lounge with snacks for judges and coaches.
