2024 Point Loma TPDA Round Robin: Tournament of Champions

Introduction:

On Friday October 25th, 2024 Point Loma Nazarene University will host the 25th Annual Point Loma Round Robin Tournament of Champions. This one-day event matches 10 of the top TPDA schools across the nation against each other in a modified round robin format.

Philosophy & History:

This tournament was begun in 1998 for several reasons. We saw a need for a tournament that gathered the best of the nation's debaters together with the idea of providing a pleasant yet competitive environment, three quality judges per round for excellent feedback and tips on avenues for improvement, and nicely catered meals to celebrate those that have risen to the top of our activity. This tournament has not only offered a nice opportunity for iron to sharpen iron, but it creates a nice learning atmosphere for others to watch and learn from those who have consistently reached a high level of success. The goal was and is to serve the community in several areas. The top teams could improve by debating other top teams. Beginning teams could improve by watching some of these stellar matches. And the entire community could benefit from a strong field of competition at the Sunset Cliffs Classic, which immediately follows the Round Robin and usually includes most of the Round Robin Tournament of Champions teams in the Open Division of competition. We thank you all for your support in past years and look forward to your continued participation in upcoming years. In Fall of 2024 we will feature a format of debate gaining in popularity, called TPDA debate, a format we believe will catch on in our region once folks get a chance to see its many benefits.

Methodology:

The 10 schools whose successful bids will be selected will be divided into two pools of five teams, and will debate every team in their pool, plus receive a bye round in the preliminary five rounds. Pools will be rank ordered, and seeded on win-loss records, ballots, then speaker points from rounds 1-5. The top two winners per pool will advance to semifinals, power protecting the teams as they hit the top two teams from the other pool. The winner of each of those semifinal debates will meet in the Final Round to be held at 7:30 p.m. in the Cunningham A & B Nicholson Student Center. This public debate is open to the community, as will the earlier rounds if seats are available.

Tournament Bids:

Schools from around the nation will be invited to submit bids for a top TPDA team to be considered for entering the Round Robin Tournament of Champions. The bid should contain the names and some competitive high lights from the two debaters proposed as a team, whether by their team or individual debate accomplishments, mentioning the particular format being highlighted in the bid. The school bid should also include the name of the critic being submitted as a judge for the event and their judging philosophy. Tournament TPDA judges cannot also be judging other events that same day. Hybrid team bids will not be allowed, nor should schools submit multiple bids per school. Fees

A charge of \$100 dollars per team will be assessed and every team is required to provide a qualified critic for each round through finals. Catered meals will be provided to the two debaters and one judge. Checks can be made payable to PLNU and please notate PLNU Speech and Debate Tournament somewhere on the check.

These recommendations will also be considered for the Sunset Cliffs Classic parliamentary topics in IPDA, TPDA and NPDA.

Rules and Guidelines

First and foremost we are governed by the rules of the campus, which, for example, disallow smoking, drinking alcoholic beverages, recreational use of drugs, sexual harassment, etc. . . Then we will make every attempt to follow IPDA sanctioned practices and norms regarding times, rules, prep, delivery, content, not breaking brackets, etc. for TPDA rounds, though the Tournament Director reserves the right to make changes from those practices if circumstances call for it. For example, we are governed by a tight schedule due to catering demands, so we hope no time-consuming formal protests are followed, and if they are, we will attempt to resolve those as fairly and quickly as possible but will not be bound by IPDA or PSCFA appeals procedures as this is not the IPDA National Championship Tournament or a PSCFA Sanctioned Tournament. Phones may not be used to keep time in rounds, and brackets will not be broken though that should not be an issue here. Judges, coaches, and competitors alike are asked to be respectful of others both in oral and written comments. Debate at this tournament aims to promote disagreeing in an agreeable manner. Thanks for understanding.
