You and your students are cordially invited to attend the Jim McPherson Classic tournament **in person** at Whitworth University in Spokane on **Saturday, October 22 and Sunday, October 23, 2022**. We will offer all traditional **11 NST events** in open division and Editorial Commentary. If entries warrant, we aspire to offer **novice** extemp, impromptu, informative, persuasion and prose. We will offer novice and open divisions of **IPDA**.

The tournament is named for a retired distinguished Whitworth professor of Communication Studies. In honor of his research interests, some of the topics in IPDA and limited prep events will address media ethics, media criticism and women's rights.

All the campus academic buildings in use are less than a five-minute walk from tournament headquarters in the Hixson Union Building, and have elevators. Campus food services will be open all weekend. Please let us know if you have competitors, coaches, or critics who need ADA accommodation.

This tournament adheres to the AFA-NST Code of Ethics, the Northwest Forensics Conference Code of Ethics & Equity, and the IPDA Constitution. The tab room will be staffed by our good friends Dan Broyles and Jennifer Conner from Pacific University. Whitworth coaches will be equity officials at this tournament. And we plan to use electronic ballots on SpeechWire for this in-person tournament.

**COVID:** Hopefully the worst is behind us. We will publicize and follow all directives from the Spokane County Health District that may be in place at that time. We encourage all campus visitors to be vaccinated.

**DIVISIONS:** We will offer novice and open divisions for IPDA and for extemp, prose, persuasion, impromptu and informative as entries warrant (more than 12 in IPDA and more than 10 in IE). Please use the following guidelines to determine the appropriate divisions for your students:

**Novice** – Students in the novice division must be undergraduate students in their first four semesters of collegiate forensics, and as per NFC rules, have fewer than three trophies per category (interp, platform, debate, limited prep) and have not completed a bachelor's degree.

**Open** – Students in the open division must be undergraduate students with eight or fewer semesters of intercollegiate forensics experience who have not completed a bachelor's degree.

**ENTRIES:** Students may *triple-enter* within either IE pattern of competition. Students are responsible for getting to all rounds on time. Students may only compete in one Duo. Student in Extemp should do that event prior to doing their other event(s).

**RESTRICTIONS:** If we run into issues with entries, divisions or availability of rooms and judges, we reserve the right to impose the following restrictions as needed. If there are less than 12 entries in IPDA, we will collapse novice into open accordingly. If there are less than 9 entries in an IE, we will collapse that division

**Placement** – Students competing in novice that have surpassed the restrictions for this division will be reassigned to the open division at the discretion of the tournament director.

### **INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC DEBATE (IPDA)**

Procedures will follow standard IPDA/NFC guidelines. We will use 5-2-6-2-3-5-3 time limits and 30 minutes of preparation. Debaters will be presented with five resolutions and each side will have two strikes. Topics will be drawn from a variety of current events and include policy, value, fact and metaphor resolutions.

### **INDIVIDUAL EVENTS**

ALL Students are responsible for making it to their rounds on time – **competitors MUST arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the end of the current round to be given a chance to compete.** AFA-NST descriptions and rules apply to individual events. **Pattern A:** CA, Duo, Impromptu, Informative, Poetry & Editorial Commentary

**Pattern B:** ADS, DI, Extemp, Persuasion, POI, Prose

All impromptu speakers in the same room will choose between the same pair of quotations.

Extemp questions will be drawn from the previous 60 days of news (not fake news).

**AWARDS:** Certificates (or something similarly inexpensive, yet thrilling) will be awarded to all IE finalists and IPDA elimination round participants. Sweepstakes awards will be given to the top three teams.

**PENTATHLON:** Students entering five IEs or four IEs plus IPDA will be eligible for the Pentathlon award. Sweepstakes points accrued in out rounds will be tallied to determine rankings. Tiebreaker system will follow total out round points, number of first place wins, number of breaks to elimination rounds, and then proximity to breaking in non-advancing events. (If students enter six or seven events, we will tally their best five events)

**Editorial Commentary:** This event is meant to simulate a radio or television editorial commentary. The student will prepare a manuscript, which attempts to influence an audience toward a particular position related to a current event. The competitor will deliver this speech while seated at a table or desk (as a news anchor would). The time limit is 3:45-4:15 minutes, and should be strictly adhered to. Judges are to give NO time signals, though the competitors may time themselves or receive time signals from a coach or teammate. Manuscripts are allowed.

**JUDGING REQUIREMENTS:** We ask schools to provide qualified judges for the tournament to cover the majority of their entries. Judges should have a college degree – no undergraduate students who are still competing may judge. Restrictions may be imposed for schools that do not provide a reasonable number of judges to cover their entry. One judge will cover eight IE slots, and four IPDA debaters.
